








REVENUE FY 23/24




EXPENSES

FREE COMMUNITY PROGRAMMING

Roots & Wings Music Education for Pre-K and Elementary



Hometown Choir

Each week, 225 children experience FREE music enrichment at YMCA after-school programs at all six Charlottesville City Elementary Schools. Students learn songs, write their own, and join with new friends across the city for performances at community events.





Pre-K Music Classes

Front Porch teaching artists bring joyous, high-quality music classes to 311 preschoolers in 24 classrooms every week. Music helps students build language, learn to count, process emotions, and regulate their bodies. Early childhood music is also linked to improved academic and social outcomes - and it's fun! Most of these classrooms would not receive music classes otherwise.











West-African Dance

Every week, Lillie Williams teaches West-African drumming and dance to 25 students at the Boys & Girls Clubs.

Music for Seniors & Hospice

Music helps connect seniors to lost memories - and each other. Partnerships with Hospice of the Piedmont, JABA, and others bring music to more than a hundred of our elderly neighbors each week.

EXPANDING OUR MUSICAL COMMUNITY 2023-PRESENT

- Emily Morrison founds The Front Porch in 2015.
- Classes begin in the living room of her Belmont home with three teachers and less than 20 students.
- The Front Porch moves to a building at Mountaintop Montessori in 2016 after classes began flowing out of Emily's living room into the rest of her home.
- The Front Porch moves downtown in 2017. In 2018, community support allows for upstairs expansion to accommodate a growing student roster.
- Roots & Wings (free community programming) begins, serving 142 students each week, including "Music Mentors" in middle schools and the pilot year of Hometown Choir!
- By 2019, more than 20 teaching artists instruct approximately 300 students and The Front Porch hosts regular concerts.
- COVID brings live music and in-person classes to a halt.
- Over one weekend, The Front Porch transitions to online learning. All teachers and staff keep their positions.
- The Front Porch's Save The Music series produces 85 livestream concerts with over 240k views, 202 paid performers, and nearly \$20K raised for area nonprofits.
- Rivanna Roots Concert Series begins in 2021 presenting family-friendly outdoor concerts at Rivanna River Co.
- With new partnerships and staff, The Front Porch's Roots & Wings program explodes back in person. More than 350 students take free music classes every week.
- The Front Porch expands to Dale Avenue to make room for students who joined during the pandemic.
- Concerts resume in the indoor listening room, and Rivanna Roots grows to connect 5,000+ community members.
- The student roster reaches 550, with more students performing and collaborating than ever before.
- More than 650 children experience FREE music classes each week through Roots & Wings.
- New partnerships with Hospice of the Piedmont, Linden House, JABA, and others bring musical joy to hundreds of elderly neighbors.
- Rivanna Roots becomes a Charlottesville staple, bridging music and the beautiful outdoors.
- The Front Porch continues to creatively deepen connections within the community and begins dreaming for the next evolution of The Front Porch's home.
